

In Uganda, Babyface is stealing the show!

Most famed for its mountain gorillas, Uganda has twelve species of primates, however an extra special chimp named Babyface who lives in the little-visited Budungo Forest Reserve, home to 800 wild chimps has become something of a local celeb.

Despite being an adult chimp, the pigmentation on his face is very pale, instead of the usual black colour common to chimps; this makes him easily recognisable and very photogenic.
